




Miss Read 2006 - July 31, 2019

But this is the picture that tells my story with our library cat the best and shows her as I'll always remember her. I didn't see Miss Read every day but after the start we had I was lucky to see her at all. She knew I had four dogs at home and that shortly after I came, her



beloved Rachel left. She hissed at me. She arched her back and ran sideways.

Sometimes, if I tried too hard, she even smacked me. But I was persistent and I won her over. (Treats in my desk helped.) We soon settled into a routine. When I was the most involved in my work she would appear beside my desk and wait for a treat, after announcing herself with a "meow". I'd treat and she'd move on. But sometime during that first year she began eating her treat and staying. I'd pet her and she'd rub her face on the corner of my desk and the file cabinet, just in case she forgot later that I was no longer the enemy. We were friends, close enough friends that sometimes she'd stare at me from the other side of the room until I'd come sit on the couch with her. There she'd occasionally get a little smart with me, but it meant something different by then. It meant that she wasn't ready for me to get up and leave her. I know how she felt. After thirteen years as our faithful friend we weren't ready for her to leave us.

Cattaraugus Gives

Since 2012, the Tuesday following Thanksgiving in the US has become a day to shine a spotlight on generosity. Giving Tuesday began as a collaboration between New York City's 92nd Street Y and the United Nations Foundation and has grown into a global day of giving. Becoming involved at a local level is encouraged, and those wishing to donate to our library on that day can do so through the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation. Their Giving Tuesday initiative is known as Cattaraugus Gives. Cattaraugus Gives is a 24-hour online fundraising event that begins on Tuesday, December 5th at midnight and ends at 11:59. Gifts of any amount made through our website during that time are impactful because the Foundation offers additional monetary incentives that are based on the number of gifts given at particular times. 


Summer Reading 2019: A Universe of Stories

Bev Jones from Pfeiffer Nature Center kicked off our theme with some stories, an exciting outdoor game and some crafts.

During the summer, the youngest children enjoyed author Frank Asch's stories *Happy Birthday, Moon* and *Bear Shadow. There's No Place Like Space* by Tish Rabe and *Astronaut Handbook* by Meghan McCarthy were also enjoyed by young and old alike. These books are available to check out at our library.





Summer Programming

In August, we welcomed art instructor Charlotte YerpeStock , who presented a workshop for adults and teens. All materials were provided so that each participant could create a corn husk doll.

Kids, accompanied by a parent or other adult, were invited to visit the library for a six week Summer Cooking Camp. Important food preparation skills were taught by preparing recipes such as Nachos Reinvented and Sunshine Rollups. The program was presented by the Cornell Cooperative Extension of Cattaraugus County.
